From Our NATIONAL DIRECTOR

s Praxeis begins our second decade, we are encouraged by the growth in many vital areas. People within the movement have grown to over 12,000! We now have nearly 1,400 disciple-makers in action and over 1,500 groups (not including India]. All of this is fueled by nearly 3,000 hours of passionate prayer per week. At the writing of this report, well over 10,000 people are discovering God in discovery groups. These figures do not include the explosive growth encountered in India, with over 2,000 groups in Central India and another 29,000 gatherings in North India in which we have been involved through training and coaching.

Our mission is to make disciples, and this is what we measure: how many people are discovering God and becoming His disciples. Through prayer and encountering God, hearing His voice as they read His word, taking steps of obedience each time they hear His word, and sharing with others, transformation happens. These four areas are the marks of a disciple. As people engage in these practices, the kingdom comes.

Our strategy is summed up in four basic actions: we pray, we engage by 'going,' we disciple in groups, and we make disciples who multiply. This report has been structured around our strategy. Here, you will discover stories of people in Australia and around the world doing exactly this. Movements are made when ordinary people take simple steps of obedience. Praxeis is filled with such ordinary people. We are not that different. However, we all can take simple steps to obey the Great Commission to 'make disciples.'

My prayer is that, as you read this report, you are inspired to take simple steps of obedience in your world. For God uses ordinary people like us.

CENTRAL INDIA

We have coached movement in Central India where there are over 2,000 gatherings, with around 30,000 people discovering God extending to 11 generations. Due to heavy persecution, information gathering is difficult so, these numbers are approximate.

NORTH INDIA

We are involved in movement in North India, Nepal and Bhutan. As the movement focuses on training catalytic local leaders, it has grown to over 29,000 gatherings in India, 2,500 gatherings in Nepal and 1,050 gatherings in Bhutan thereby impacting over 260,000 people.

wo thousand years ago in Jerusalem, God poured out His Spirit, changing everything. Inspired by this, Praxeis and the wider body of Christ in Australia embarked on "Pray 48," a call to prayer, engagement with God's Word, and action across the nation.

A week of 24/7 prayer led to the 'Launch 24' gathering in Melbourne with leaders from Australia and New Zealand. This launched 25 Days of Prayer and Fasting, culminating in an All-Night Prayer on Easter Thursday and Good Friday.

The Power of Prayer in New Zealand

mayer births God's vision, mobilises workers, and engages the harvest. In New Zealand, Roger and his team felt God's challenge to stop everything else and make prayer their priority. Obediently, they refocused their efforts on prayer, seeking His guidance. As they prayed, God led them to train new workers, intercede for prisons, and connect with emerging leaders.

One day, after a time of prayer in Auckland, they met a retired pastor. Inspired by what he learned about movement principles, he began training others, sharing these concepts within his extensive networks. The ripple effect has been extraordinary—Discovery Groups have started, drug addicts and gang members are following Jesus, and many are now preparing for baptism.

This story is a reminder that when prayer becomes the foundation, transformation follows. God is moving powerfully in New Zealand, drawing people from all walks of life into His Kingdom.

or years, we've had a heart for bringing faith into aged care facilities. Erin is part of our Regional Victoria Team. One day, Erin felt a nudge as she drove past an aged care home in Ballarat. Acting on the prompting, she called an old friend who was living there. During their conversation, Erin realised her friend was questioning her faith and longing for a spiritual connection.

Erin offered to meet and explore faith together using a Discovery Bible Study [DBS]. Joined by another resident, the three of them began meeting in the home's chapel to study God's Word and pray. They also asked God to bring more people into their small group.

With support from the home's wellbeing team, their prayers were answered, and the group has now grown to 12 residents. Despite coming from diverse faith backgrounds, there is a beautiful sense of unity as they gather.

After one session, a man was moved to tears as he shared, "My wife went to church, but I never did." Now, he is a regular and enthusiastic member of the group. Faith is taking root in unexpected places, reminding us that it's never too late to

encounter God.

From Chicken heads to Discovery groups!

n Southeast Asia, our teams are working tirelessly to spark a movement among an unreached people group. Amisha, a second-generation disciple-maker, is being trained to live out her calling making disciples. She began praying for ways to connect in a local marketplace but, as an outsider with no trading experience, she felt unsure. Observing the market, she connected with Fany, a street trader, and together they began selling deepfried chicken heads.

This gave Amisha an authentic reason to engage in the community. As their business took off, she noticed many traders lacked basic resources to start trading. She arranged microloans and and even organised a literacy program for local teens. Now, teaming with Fany, Amisha has identified key people of peace and, using her DMM training, has launched three discovery groups so far.

From selling chicken heads to transforming lives, Amisha is witnessing the power of God at work, one relationship at a time.

paths with our Monash Uni team during an Easter prayer walk, that this encounter would ignite a powerful transformation in his life and the lives of those around him. As an international student from Hong Kong who hadn't set foot in a church for years, Edward's heart was stirred after the team prayed for him.

God was already at work in Edward's circle of friends from China and South East Asia, with several students hungry to learn more about Jesus. Within weeks, the team helped Edward step into the role of facilitator for what his group

called a 'Discovery Circle'. Bible stories about
Jesus were soon being read in four different
languages, including Mandarin, Cantonese, and
Vietnamese, as students learned to pray and
share what they were learning in their heart
languages.

Over the next two semesters, Edward, the only Christian in the group, grew into his role as a disciple-maker. Upon graduation, he remained in Australia and joined the Praxeis UniVision team, continuing his disciple-making journey in Queensland. Meanwhile, many of his former classmates are still being discipled into a relationship with Jesus as they too learn to become a disciple-maker like Edward.

Edward's story is a beautiful reminder of how
God can take a single encounter and use
it to multiply disciples who will make
disciples, continuing His work beyond
the walls of the university.

A move of God: from a small spark to a wildfire of faith

teve grew up amid the lush, steamy jungles of Western Province, Papua New Guinea.

After moving to Australia, he and his wife, Mel, became passionate disciple-makers with Praxeis in far North Queensland. But God had a bigger plan—calling Steve back to the very place where his journey began.

During a visit to a remote village, Steve connected with a local pastor eager to learn. He trained him in facilitating a Discovery Group—a simple, transformative way to explore God's Word. Inspired, the pastor immediately gathered 47 men from the community, men who were outside the church but hungry to learn about God.

A week later, the pastor paddled four hours upstream to share the incredible news with Steve: the group had embraced the discovery process and was deeply moved by it. Encouraged, Steve challenged the pastor to empower these men to take the discovery process back to their families.

What started as a small spark grew into a wildfire of faith. By early 2024, this movement had led to the baptism of over 7,000 men, women, and children—each transformed by encountering God through the discovery process. And the journey continues...

Seeds of Prayer Bearing Fruit Across Borders



1 ears ago, Gabriella and her team prayerwalked through regions in Hungary, Ukraine, and Romania, trusting God to work in His time. Today, those very areas are seeing a movement of people eager to learn disciple-making.

In Hungary, Gerger started a Discovery Bible Study (DBS) among gypsies and another within a church. As people came to faith, the groups grew and eventually combined. Gerger began training

18 disciples, who then invited others to join. This multiplication resulted in four new DBS groups with 26 second-generation participants—all from the harvest.

In Ukraine, prayers sown during 2014 prayerwalks seemed to bear no immediate fruit. Fast forward to today, Hungarian leaders Gabriella and Gerger have since connected with Alex, who oversees 19 churches. Seeing the potential for disciple-making, Alex invited the team to train 52 church leaders in Disciple-Making Movements [DMM]. These leaders have since launched DBS groups, organised prayer meetings, and facilitated disciple-making training sessions.

The impact has been remarkable: in the last year three new churches have been planted, 25-30 people have been baptised, and 50 new disciples are following Jesus. From seeds of prayer to a thriving harvest, God is moving powerfully across borders and communities.

REGIONS OF MYANMAR ENGAGED WITH 68 **DISCOVERY GROUPS**

The Singapore Team launched the Urban Wheat Project to equip Asian leaders to multiply discipleship among the 95% not connected to traditional churches. Pursuing their vision of discipleship networks in 15 Asian cities over five years, they now have open doors in four cities, including Singapore.

FINANCES

e are profoundly grateful to everyone who has invested in the ministry of Praxeis. This work would not be possible without the faithful partnership of those who support our workers, fund ministry needs, and fuel disciple-making initiatives across nations.

In a time when global cost-of-living pressures are being felt by many, God's provision through your generosity stands out as a testament to His faithfulness. We thank God for His ongoing provision and for the incredible partners who make this Kingdom work possible. Together, we are seeing lives transformed and nations impacted for His glory.

Giving towards ministry funds and projects has increased compared to FY23. This includes contributions given to appeals like the Herat earthquake and Christmas appeals. These funds enabled us to provide food to earthquake-affected households, deliver food packages to Ukrainian gypsy soldiers, and support the purchase of motorbikes for Southeast Asian workers.

However, giving to Praxeis general running costs has decreased by 28% compared to FY23, creating some challenges for operational costs.


values. With his legal expertise, he will provide strong leadership to the board ensuring Praxeis continues with strong governance.
